TEMATYCZNY ZBIÓR ĆWICZEŃ to zestaw składający się z dwóch książek adresowanych do wszystkich osób zainteresowanych aktywną nauką słownictwa angielskiego. Obydwie książki zawierają szeroki wachlarz praktycznych ćwiczeń ujętych w rozmaitych grupach tematycznych podzielonych na wiele podtematów i związanych z nimi zagadnień. Każdy dział tematyczny otwierają ćwiczenia prezentujące słownictwo podstawowe dla danego zakresu. Poziom trudności zadań rośnie wraz z kolejnymi ćwiczeniami. Taka forma książki daje uczącej się osobie możliwość poznania lub utrwalenia leksykonu o szerokim zakresie, rozpoczynając od słownictwa podstawowego, po słownictwo wyższego rejestru, w tym także idiomy, wyrażenia potoczne i przysłowia. Łącznie w obydwu cześciach zestawu zastosowano ponad 10,000 słów z rozmaitych kategorii tematycznych. Ogromna większość słów i wyrażeń występujących w ćwiczeniach stanowi baze leksykalną będącą w codziennym użyciu. Ćwiczenia dla osób bardziej zaawansowanych prezentują także szczegółowy zakres leksykonu, co umożliwia zapoznanie się ze słownictwem branżowym, jak na przykład nazwy chorób, związków chemicznych, cześci budowy środków lokomocji, nazwy drzew i roślin, obiektów sportowych i wiele innych. Tak obszerny zakres słownictwa umożliwia nabycie rozległej wiedzy o leksykonie angielskim, zaś praktyczne ćwiczenia znacznie ułatwiają proces zapamiętywania słów i wyrażeń. Dla uproszczenia pracy nad słownictwem oraz umożliwienia swobodnej nauki, na końcu książki umieszczony został klucz z odpowiedziami do ćwiczeń oraz słowniczek angielsko-polski, zawierający objaśnienia znaczeń słów i wyrażeń występujących w ćwiczeniach.

Konstrukcja książki pozwala na swobodne korzystanie z ćwiczeń zarówno osobom rozpoczynającym naukę języka angielskiego, jak i uczniom na wyższych poziomach zaawansowania, a także nauczycielom języka angielskiego. Sposób wykorzystania ćwiczeń zawartych w niniejszym zestawie można dostosować do własnych wymagań. Dla optymalnego efektu warto przerobić cały materiał, rozwiązując poszczególne zadania 'krok po kroku' z wszystkich kategorii tematycznych. Uczeń może także skoncentrować się na określonej grupie leksykalnej, która go interesuje lub która ułatwi przygotowanie się do zajęć, testów lub egzaminów. Dla utrwalenia jak największej ilości przydatnych słów i wyrażeń warto wykonać ćwiczenia ponownie, szczególnie te, które przysparzają najwięcej trudności. Dlatego, nie jest wskazane rozwiązywanie zadań na kartkach książki.

Niniejszy zestaw książek do nauki słownictwa został napisany z myślą o osobach, które w sposób aktywny, a jednocześnie przyjemny pragną poszerzyć znajomość leksykonu angielskiego oraz nabrać biegłości w codziennym użyciu tego języka. Stymulujące ćwiczenia pomogą w opanowaniu szerokiego zakresu słownictwa, a to z kolei zaowocuje umiejętnością budowania bogatych i elokwentnych wypowiedzi. Korzystanie z niniejszego zestawu książek powinno także ułatwić przygotowanie się do wielu rozmaitych egzaminów w tym także do ustnego egzaminu maturalnego.

#### FILM REVIEW: "Ray"

"Ray" is a musical biographical movie in which Jamie Foxx gives a stunning ......(1) as soul, jazz and blues great Ray Charles. Foxx becomes a Ray's copy, helped by the Genius himself, whom we hear on the ......(2) singing dozens of his hits from the 1950s and '60s. Since Charles was one of the most universally loved and distinctive - through his blindness - 20th century pop stars, one would think any actor would find it hard to bring him back to life. But Foxx succeeds almost totally: talking, moving and playing, but not singing, with such inspired mimicry that you tend to accept him completely. In result, the movie, is a terrific picture, worthy of its ......(3). Charles could make your heart beat faster and your body sway with I Got a Woman, Georgia on My Mind, Hit the Road Jack or Come Rain or Come Shine. But he also was, as this movie shows us, fallible and flawed, a heroin addict and a womanizer. "Ray", which Charles himself saw and approved before his recent death, shows the singer from his 1930s childhood to the height of ......(4) in the mid-'60s. The ......(5) is on the time between his departure from Georgia in 1948, and 1965 when, at the top of the charts and his profession, he was busted for heroin possession and decided to turn his dangerous addiction for good. With music and drama the film is a genuine ......(6) of Ray's early life in poverty and misery mixed with a rebel and ambition. We see young Ray's childhood years, mostly in .....(7), in abject poverty in rural Georgia, going blind at 5, learning piano, then hitting the road at 17 and joining the Lowell Fulson band. And then the film leaves us with his music. Hackford, the film director, exposes his idol's weaknesses yet through it all we also see him as a great artist with a sweet, strong and tender soul. "Ray" is a ......(8) to an entertainer who, no matter what hate or hardship threw in his way or how many mistakes he made, we can't stop loving.
